As President and CEO of the world's leading SMA research and services organization, I'd like to thank you for supporting the thousands of American children and adults living with Spinal Muscular Atrophy through your sponsorship of H.R. 3334, the SMA Treatment Acceleration Act.

SMA is a devastating motor neuron disorder that occurs in an estimated one in every 6,000 births and is considered to be the number-one fatal genetic disease in children under age 2. Forms of SMA strike infants and toddlers and progressively inhibit their ability to walk, move, breathe, and swallow. This is a cruel disease that does not discriminate; approximately 7.5 million Americans are thought to carry the gene that causes SMA.

Since MDA's inception in 1950, our commitment to the SMA community has been unwavering. We're delighted that our decades of contributions to research funding and clinical efforts have yielded significant advances in the scientific understanding of, and potential treatments for, this insidious disease. Now, more than ever, it's critical that a national clinical trials network be established for SMA, as well as a forum for collaboration between appropriate federal agencies.
